Tom Shares His Blueprint for Building Hope...

**Years of Service:** Started in the fall of 2001, right after 9/11.

Connection to Habitat for Humanity: After going to a service at the Valparaiso University Chapel for the victims of 9/11, I sat and I asked myself, "what am I doing to help my fellow citizens?". I called Ken Hill, a buddy who volunteered for Hilltop Neighborhood House. He said, knowing I had built my own house, that I needed to go work with Habitat. So, he gave me Bob Buhle's number, and the next Saturday I showed up with my hammer and my work pouch. Two months later I was on the Board.

**Inspiration to Continue to Serve?** The fun of the work, the comradery, the pleasure of creating a home from the ground up for folks who need one and are willing to volunteer and help themselves.

**Favorite Power Tool or On-Site Construction Task and Why?** It is all fun work. However, I think working on their home, directing large groups, and getting the walls up are the biggest thrill. When the walls go up, you know we are on our way to completing the home!

### Attainable Homeownership Tax Credit

What if I told you there was a way to improve your community *and* 2025 tax options all at once? With the Attainable Homeowner Tax Credit (AHTC) program you can! The AHTC program lets taxpayers

donate to Habitat for Humanity of Indiana benefiting the Porter County affiliate and receive half of that amount back in the form of a tax credit. **This credit directly lowers your Indiana state tax liability on your 2025 Indiana income tax bill.** 

This allows you to choose where your tax dollars are invested and helps Habitat bring families the stability that only a home can provide. Since the start of the AHTC program, taxpayers across Indiana have given over \$4 million to Habitat for Humanity! This has resulted in approximately 50 additional homes built or repaired which helps over 200 people. If we raise all \$8 million in tax credits, this will result in 100 additional homes and around 400 people served!
